GELCOAT REPAIRS – English Version

- 1. Highlight all the damaged areas to be treated.
- 2. Sand the scratches with coarse sandpaper in a V shape.
- 3. Make sure that the damaged areas are dry
- 4. Clean the damaged places and surrounding area off with acetone
- 5. Stick tape around the damaged area to protect against gelcoat spillage
- 6. Mix the required amount of gelcoat with up to 2% harder and fill in the damage.
- 7. Stick packing tape over the repair for a nice smooth result and allow the gelcoat to cure for 24 hours at 20 $^{\circ}$ C.
- 8. Remove the packaging tape and sand with a waterproof grinder at 400 grit.
- 9. To make the repair look shiny, you should finish with a finer grit ranging from 400 to 1200. As a final step polish the area with a polishing agent.

Please note:

- Step 6-9 must be repeated if the damage is not filled after the first attempt.
- Be careful not to sand the area outside the damaged area too thinly, use a sanding block on flat parts.
- Caution: Silicone based polishing agents should <u>not</u> be used.

WARNING!

- 1. Always wear gloves and avoid contact with the skin
- 2. No open flames or smoking around the repair
- 3. Keep out of reach of children

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
